As they continue the journey they battle malaria, try to reform two would-be robbers, sing Christmas carols with American missionaries, confront extortionist and dangerous Mobutu men, and come near collapse on Zaire's impassable muddy "roads." Finally, they pause to recuperate in a posh hotel, whose luxuries spell the end of their expedition together--the author rejecting modern comforts, her companion yearning for more.
