Moreover, that fuller understanding of its plural and shifting meanings—as they are examined here—has implications for the current intellectual history of the idea in Western thought. The existing narrative of luxury’s conceptual development is one of progressive upward transformation, beginning with the rise of economic liberalism amidst eighteenth-century debates; it is one that assumes essential continuity between the medieval treatment of luxury as the sin of ‘luxuria’ and early modern notions of the idea even as social practises of luxury explode in early seventeenth-century culture.
